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DO

- * Stay calm.
- * Take what the child says seriously and accept it.
- * Allow child to continue at own pace.
- * Let the child know you will need to tell someone.
- * Reassure them they've done the right thing.
- * Let the child know what will happen next.
- * Report the conservation to a designated person and complete a My Concern incident report.

DON'T

- * Promise confidentiality.
- * Ask leading questions.
- * Confront the alleged abuser.
- * Ask the child to repeat what has been said.
- * Interview other children or parents.

Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility

- * Protecting individuals from maltreatment.
- * Preventing impairment of children's health or development.
- * Safeguarding is not just about protecting children from deliberate harm.

What is safeguarding?

It also includes...

- * Pupil health and safety.
- * Bullying/cyberbullying.
- * Racist abuse.
- * Use of physical intervention/safe handling.
- * Meeting the needs of pupils with medical conditions.
- * Providing first aid.
- * Drug and substance misuse.
- * Relationships and sexuality education (RSE).
- * School security.

What is Child Protection?

Child Protection refers to the activity which is undertaken to protect specific individuals (children) who are suffering or at risk of suffering harm.
